
What are Our Commitments in 2024-25?

- Your pledge this stewardship season will support the ministries of our congregation, including:
- Continued financial strength as we prepare to receive the final mortgage income payment in 2028 from the sale of the former parsonage. (See more info in the box at right Replacing Mortgage Income in 2028.)
- Ongoing accessibility planning and work, as directed by the congregation
- A robust music program with our new director and a congregational singing leader
- A Vote Forward letter writing campaign for the upcoming election, led by our Social Justice ministry
- Future plans and programs evolving from "Who Are We?"
 Listening Circles
- Creation of a user-friendly covenant of right relations
- · Ongoing work toward recertification as a Green Sanctuary
- Ongoing development of spiritual growth programs, with the likelihood of an OWL class for youth and discernment of our further commitments of time and treasure to young families
- Cost of living raises of 4% for our exemplary and dedicated staff
- Publication of an updated history of our congregation & building for the 200th anniversary in 2025
- Continuing development of our technology (TV screens, cameras, sound systems) and regular maintenance of our older buildings



Replacing Mortgage Income in 2028

Currently, the congregation receives a yearly income from the mortgage (Principal + Interest) paid by the buyer of the former parsonage. This mortgage will be paid off in 2028, reducing annual operating income by about \$12,000. The Finance Committee proposes increasing the stewardship goal by \$3,000 per year over the next four years, and putting that money in escrow to compensate for the income loss in 2028.

What Can I Give in 2024?

In the coming fiscal year (July 1, 2024–June 30, 2025), it is projected that our congregation's expenses will increase by 10%. As a handy guideline, please see the table below for projected average weekly or monthly pledge increases based on last year's average pledge of \$175/month or \$2,100/year.

Numbers Based on Average Annual Pledge of \$2,100 for 2023	Average Annual Pledge for 2024 would be:	Average Monthly Pledge for 2024 would be:	Monthly increase over last year	Weekly increase over last year
10% Increase for 2024	\$2,310	\$193	\$18	\$4
15% Increase for 2024	\$2,415	\$201	\$26	\$6
20% Increase for 2024	\$2,520	\$210	\$35	\$8
