
This year, the stewardship season has arrived just as many feel a need to support the health of our society and to find power in community. Pledging helps to keep our loving light shining in



Being the Light: Aspirations in the New Year


- Ongoing accessibility planning and work, as directed by the congregation; exploring redesign of the chancel area and more discussions regarding how to move forward with hearing accessibility

Peplacing Mortgage Income in 2028. Currently, the congregation receives a yearly income from the mortgage (Principal + Interest) paid by the buyer of the former parsonage. This mortgage will be paid off in 2028, reducing annual operating income by about \$12,000. Beginning last year, we are preparing for the income loss by increasing our stewardship in four \$3,000 steps and saving this money to cover any gaps in 2028 and beyond.

What Can I Give for 2025-2026?

In the coming fiscal year (July 1, 2025–June 30, 2026), our congregation's expenses are projected to increase 8%. As a handy guideline, please see the table below for projected average weekly or monthly pledge increases based on last year's average pledge of \$188/month or \$2,250/year.

As always, every pledge will be gratefully received no matter the amount. Please give what feels right for you. If you are able, please consider a pledge increase between 10% and 20%.
